Ten Nonprofit Resource “Roundups” Offered Across the State of Oregon *How nonprofits can tap into resources, make connections and grow networks*

Portland, Ore. – In partnership with funders from across the state, the Nonprofit Association of Oregon is kicking off ten Nonprofit Resource Roundups for 2017 in primarily rural communities across the state. These sessions will offer staff, board members and volunteers of nonprofit organizations the opportunity to: build connections with other nonprofit organizations in the region and grow their networks, learn about foundation resources and grant opportunities and meet funder representatives, connect with NAO resources to support their nonprofits’ success and explore and discuss current policy and proposals that impact Oregon nonprofit organizations. In 2016 NAO convened sessions in six locations across the state. Participants’ feedback was very positive, spurring NAO and its partners to extend these sessions to even more locations.

The 2017 Nonprofit Resource Roundups are scheduled to be held in Roseburg (March 20), Coos Bay (March 22), Newport (March 23), Madras (April 19), Fossil (April 20), Silverton (May 4), McMinnville (May 5), La Grande (May 16), Hermiston (May 17) and Klamath Falls (June 7). The three-hour long sessions include time for presentations, discussion, and networking. Nonprofit organization staff, board members and volunteers in these regions are invited to attend the session of their choice. Sessions are offered at no cost to participants, however, registration is required. Light food and refreshments are provided.
